Linda Ronstadt, best-selling solo female performer of the 1970s, was diagnosed in 2013. "Parkinson's is very hard to diagnose, so when I finally went to a neurologist and he said, 'Oh, you have Parkinson's disease,' I Was completely shocked. I wouldn't have suspected that in a million, billion years."

"The disease affects everybody differently, and you can't generalize from one person's experience to someone else's."



Up to 60 percent of people with Parkinson's disease experience mild or moderate depressive symptoms. Research suggests the disease itself causes chemical changes in the brain that may lead to depression.
